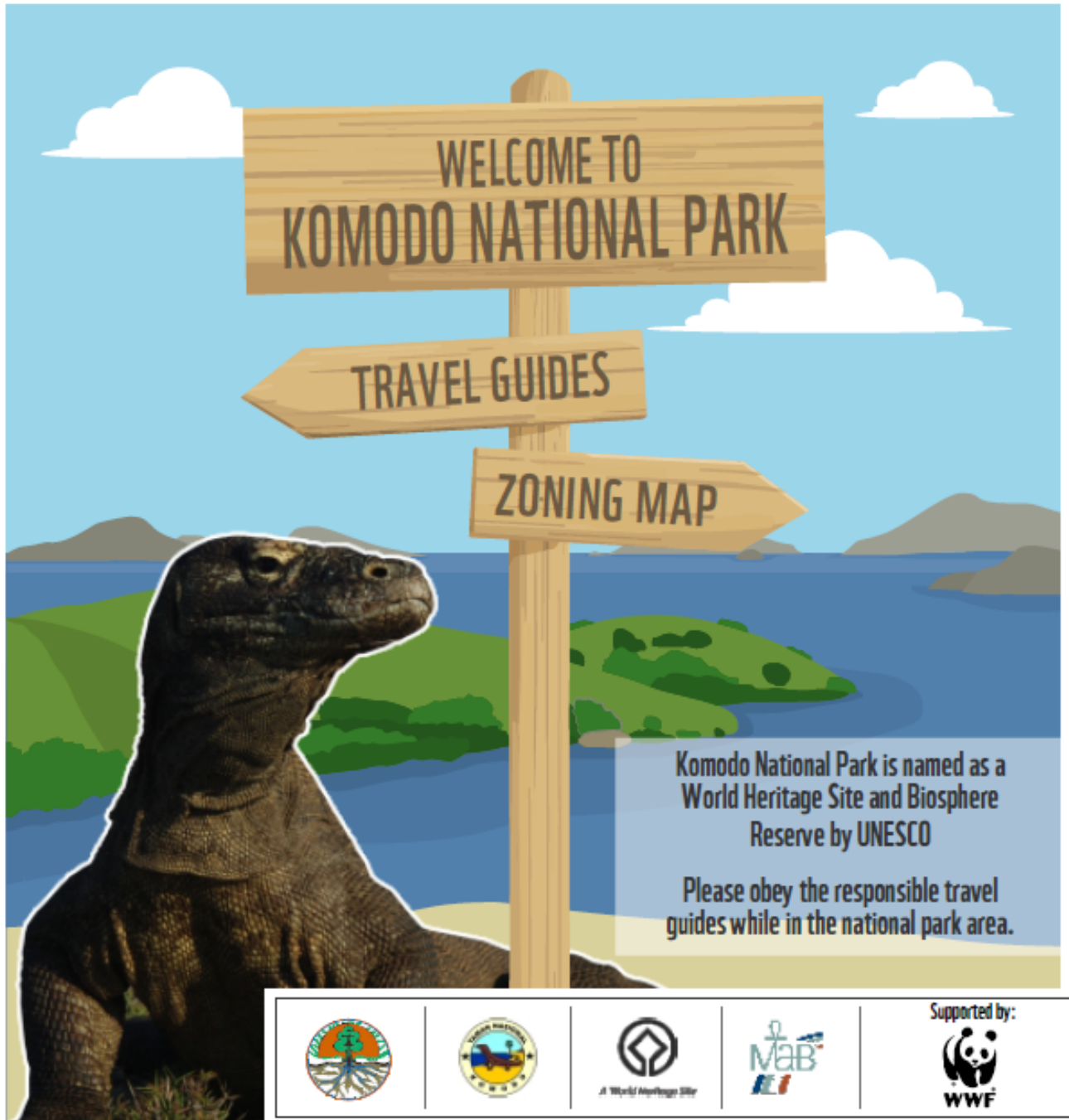

- **Follow your designated guide or ranger.** Komodo dragons are dangerous, wild animals so you must be accompanied by an authorised Komodo National Park's ranger at all times. It is forbidden to walk around alone, or go off the designated trails.
- **Listen to your ranger's instructions and do not disturb the Komodo Dragons.** It is not permitted to make loud, sudden or surprising noises which could possibly make the Komodo dragon angry or defensive.
- **Keep your distance.** Always maintain a safe distance of approximately 3-5 metres from the Komodo dragon to protect yourself from sudden attacks. When observing a dragon in close proximity, remain calm and alert and do not make any panicky or rapid movements.
- **Do not lure or attempt to engage with Komodo Dragons.** It is forbidden to swing an object in front of a Komodo dragon; it could perceive you as prey that must be hunted.

- **Bringing food to the island and feeding the dragons is prohibited.** The dragons have a very acute sense of smell so any food items will attract unwanted and potentially dangerous attention. Visitors should only bring (plenty of) water or other odourless items.
- **Fires and smoking are prohibited.** The vast habitat in which the dragons live is very hot, dry and barren. Even the smallest spark can cause deadly fires to spread very rapidly. Therefore, lighting fires and smoking in this area are prohibited to preserve the delicate environment.
- **Take nothing but pictures, leave nothing but footprints.** Taking anything from this area is illegal under Indonesia National Law.

PLEASE NOTE: Visitors wishing to use a drone around Komodo National Park MUST obtain a permit in advance of their visit. However, their use is prohibited in some areas.

- Use of DPVs (underwater scooters), gloves, reef hooks and dive knives* is not allowed. (*Knives can only be used by trained staff and only in the event of an emergency or rescue situation).
- Maintain good buoyancy on all dives to avoid getting too close to corals, sand, reefs and animals.
- Ensure all equipment is properly secured to prevent it dragging or knocking against corals or the seabed.
- Do not touch, kneel or step on anything underwater.
- Respect the natural habitat and behaviour of marine life when taking photos - Do not disturb or move anything for the sake of creating 'the perfect picture'
- Do not feed the marine life.
- Take nothing but photos, leave nothing but bubbles.
